The project of DSZC Bethlen Gábor Secondary School of Economics is entitled 'Stick together - Stand against discrimination in the EU'. Students from four countries (Germany, Spain, Italy and Hungary), working together on the programme, aim at achieving better understanding and combating prejudices by learning about the phenomenon of discrimination, in the interests of an open and democratic European society. Participants examine the phenomenon of discrimination from different aspects (e.g. mental, physical, ethnic, religious, cultural). As part of the co-operation process, nearly 800 students familiarise themselves with the topic and as in former Comenius projects, students do research into the topic, make presentations and short films while all four partners present their work at project meetings. A novel aspect of this project is the creation of a boardgame by the students. This enables participants to better understand the situation with regard to minorities in each individual country as well as the meaning of the fight against discrimination
